The first National Event of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada was held June 16 to 19 at The Forks in Winnipeg, Man. The event brought together Canadians, survivors and their families, former school staff and others affected by the Indian Residential Schools (IRS) experience. It provided opportunities for statement gathering, healing and greater awareness for all Canadians.

Harmony: Song and Celebration at The Forks is produced by Farpoint Films and executive produced by Carl Karp. It is part of *CBC Manitoba Presents*, a six-part summer series airing Saturdays at 7 p.m. on CBC Television in Manitoba.
